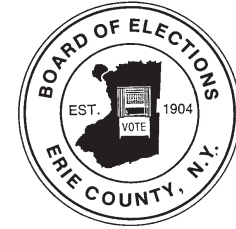

### **SIGNATURE REQUIREMENTS FOR DESIGNATING AND OPPORTUNITY TO BALLOT PETITIONS**

Election Law §6-136

5% of the enrolled voters of the political party in the political unit (excluding voters in inactive status) or the following, whichever is less: For any office to be filled by all the voters of:

The entire state.....	15,000
At least 100 or 5% of enrolled voters from each of 1/2 of the congressional districts.	
County and City Wide Buffalo offices .....	1,500
Congressional Districts .....	937
State Senatorial Districts .....	750
State Assembly Districts .....	375
County Legislative Districts.....	375
District Councilman, Supervisor and all elective town offices.....	375
All elective offices in the Cities of Lackawanna & Tonawanda .....	375
Delegates & Alternates to the Judicial Convention.....	375
State Committee Members (male & female).....	375

June 5	Notices of change of address from registered voters received by June 5 by a county board of elections must be processed in time for the primary election.

### **ABSENTEE VOTING**

June 18	Last day to postmark application for ballot or letter of application for ballot.
June 24	Last day to apply in person for ballot.
June 24	Last day to postmark ballot including Military. Ballots including Military must be received by the county board no later than July 2.
June 25	Last day to deliver ballot in person to the board of elections by 9pm.
May 31	Last day for board of elections to receive application for ballot if not previously registered.
June 18	Last day for board of elections to receive application for ballot if previously registered.

Oct. 16	Notices of change of address from registered voters received by Oct. 17 by a county board of elections must be processed in time for the general election.

### **CHANGE OF ENROLLMENT**

Oct. 11	Last day to change enrollment using a mail registration form for the <b>2020</b> Primary Election. Must be postmarked before midnight.

### **ABSENTEE AND SPECIAL FEDERAL VOTING**

Election Law §8-400(2), 8-412(1), 10-114(1), 11-212

Oct. 29	Last day to postmark application or letter of application for ballot.
Nov. 4	Last day to apply in person for ballot.
Nov. 4	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the board of elections no later than Nov. 12. Military and Special Federal Voter ballots must be received no later than Nov. 18.
Nov. 5	Last day to deliver ballot in person to the board of elections by 9pm.

### **MILITARY VOTERS**

Election Law §10-106(5), 11-202(1)(b)(c)

Oct. 26	Last day for board of elections to receive application for ballot if not previously registered.
Oct. 29	Last day for board of elections to receive application for ballot if previously registered.
Nov. 4	Last day to apply personally if previously registered.
